Editors Note:

Below is Craig Moodie's report from this months Ulyssian. While most of you have probably read it I would recommend it to anyone that has not.



Turning differences into unity rather than Division.

As a club we are a varied bunch of people held together by our interest and passion for motorcycles.

I am proud to be a part of this awesome bunch of people and I'm committed to preserving what makes us special. Let's celebrate the good times riding and socializing and belonging to a great group.

We have members who enjoy one or many of the following things:

We like to ride long distances, short distances, different speeds, highways, byways, off-road, gravel, long tours, adventure camping, drag racing, track days, and the list goes on. Some members ride and don't go to branch meeting nights.

Some go to branch meeting nights and don't ride much. Some do most things that are happening, and some only occasionally join in. Some enjoy a beer, and

some don't drink. Some like going to social events, and some don't. Some no longer ride for various reasons but

appreciate belonging to the club. We have people of various

ages, sexes and interests. Creating an environment where everyone is welcome is the recipe for a thriving branch.

Yes, we all have an interest in motorcycles but we have a wide range of other interests, opinions and backgrounds. So how do we bring everyone together and have a good time? To have something that ask and we will never get it right for everyone. In my time as Auckland branch president, Raewyn and I made it our top priority to make everyone welcome without judgment. As Auckland branch president and now on Natcom I have seen how differences can turn into

pleases everyone is a big

conflict, and if it carries on, it can lead to division. The purpose of this article

is aimed at giving some suggestions that can help turn these situations around and make them into something positive.

In order to create unity we must welcome different ideas and interests. Let me explain with a fictional illustration.

Suppose we have a runs co-ordinator that puts on great rides which are generally about 250km, and the pace is such that it suits more experienced riders who maintain a steady speed with very few stops. They corner efficiently and therefore cover the distance quite quickly. This will attract riders with similar interest and style. This style of ride then drops into the regular format.

Unfortunately there are also new riders who are learning the skills, older riders who would prefer to cruise at a more sedate pace, riders who love putting around on their scooters, riders who love exploring back country trails, like doing ultra long rides, like multi day tours etc etc etc.

What we need to do is turn these differences into a good and positive thing. Rather than relying on the runs co-ordinator to come up with something for everyone, we should turn this around and encourage those people with different interests to get out there and put together a ride/ event which suits their interests and let everyone know they are welcome to join in. The role of the runs co-ordinator should be to co-ordinate the runs, i.e. manage the calendar to avoid timetable clashes and let everyone know what is happening.

Having a good turn out should not always be the measure of success but rather whether you had a good time. Keeping everyone informed as to what's happening and how it went adds to the fabric of the branch.

This same principle should

also be applied to all the activities happening within the branch. Rather than having a runs co-ordinator, the role needs to be expanded to calendar co-ordinator.

We all naturally tend to gather into groups of common interest and catch up with our mates etc. This is quite often evident at branch meeting nights. To some people, especially new members this can be seen as a bit of a clique. Most of the time this is not the case. We all need to put forward an effort to make people feel welcome and if you are organising a bit of a gathering of Ulyssian friends, consider opening it up by putting it on the calendar e.g. an open invitation to come around on a Saturday night for a BBQ or meeting up at the pub on a Friday night. You may not get extra takers but it adds to what is going on in the branch.

New Guard vs Old Guard syndrome:

This often comes up as an issue. On one side the older members hold onto the traditions and the way things have always been done, and the new guard see a need to change things up to revitalize the club and make it more attractive to new and prospective members.

Both positions are valid and important to the life of the club. Achieving a balance is key here. Our history, our culture, our heritage and our older members are vitally important to the ongoing success of our club. On the other hand making changes to ensure our future is also an essential part of moving forward.

What we have to avoid is digging trenches and lobbing grenades at each other. There is room in the fabric of our club for both aspects to co-exist and work together to create an environment where our heritage is honoured and we have a programme that offers options for everyone to be a part of it.

Bullet points for creating a

culture that people want to be part of:

 Don't lose sight of the bigger picture. We are a social club of people with a common interest in motorcycles.

Be proud of who we are.
Make an effort to create an environment where everyone is welcome.

• If you don't like what is on offer and want something else, think about offering to get in there and make it happen.

 If you are in leadership, welcome anything that adds to the fabric of the club.

 Don't hold onto grudges, life is too short for that. And you look better with your nose still attached.

 Don't try and force people to do things your way.

 Be tolerant of other people's opinions • Support those who are volunteering their time to help run the club.

 Don't criticise without being prepared to step up and help.

 Choose your battles wisely. Take a 'chill pill', stop and think about it. Does it really matter? Is it trivial and is it really worth creating a big fuss about? Will your actions damage the club? If you are prepared to destroy the club to get your own way then you should question whether or not you are actually a Ulyssian and do the honourable thing.

 If you don't like the leadership, suck it up and get on with joining in with what is happening. Later on you can always put your hand up to have a go at the next AGM.

 If you are considering volunteering for the leadership of your branch, check your motives first. You should be there because you want to serve to create a better club and not for any reasons of control, power or self-importance.

You may say I'm a dreamer but I'm not the only one. I hope someday you will join in and the branch will have more fun. (My apologies to John for butchering his lyrics)



Important Runs Information

For all rides, please be at the departure point 10 Minutes early with a FULL GAS TANK and an EMPTY BLADDER. If you are not sure if the run may be cancelled because of inclement weather phone the RIC before leaving home. Ride format

SHORT: 150 km, MEDIUM: 150 - 300 km, LONG: 300 - 500 km, XTRA/LONG: Over 500 km.

CRUISE: These runs, usually monthly on a Saturday are offered at a more leisurely pace and of short distance.

ANYONE: A ride for any Club member, noting that you are to assess your own capability in relation to the RIC of the day, the destination and likely distance.

EXPERIENCED: Intended for experienced riders these are generally longer rides with less stops to regroup.

Each RIC will carry a Mobile Phone for emergencies. You will be required to provide your own details and contact details on arrival and before the ride briefing.
