Auckland Ulysses Report from Grant Johnstone

When John, North Harbour Ulysses, and I first started talking about organizing an event, we discussed a static event at say, a Mitre10 or Bunnings, with a sausage sizzle and a few bikes for show. Then along came Vicky, with instruction from NATCOM to make it a more public event. Bigger and Brighter.

The event was to raise awareness of the general motorist, of motorcycles sharing the road. After much discussion and a few coffees, we decided on a loop around the Auckland motorway system. The route planned meant we assembled at Warehouse way and onto the motorway heading North, taking the Constellation Dr exit and following Constellation onto North Harbour Highway, leading onto the North Western then We would take the South Western fork through the Waterview Tunnel, taking the Manukau fork, taking the left lane after Lambie Dr and the entry going North on the Southern Motorway. We would follow that over the Bridge and onto Cyclespot. We rode the route a couple of times to get timing and highlight any concerns. Vicky contacted Grant from Cyclespot, the NZ Police, Auckland Transport and a

number of other Clubs, who all showed interest. John organized sausages, kept track of what we were doing and a number of other tasks. I organized use of the Carpark at Kingdom Church. I talked to the guys at Pure Café and they agreed to open up for us.

So, everything was set, it looked like we would get about 100 bikes on the day, great, it should be a success.

A few days before the weather dived to unleash a spring storm and then we got word of a big protest march going over the bridge as well, so, the decision was made to postpone to the following weekend. After many frantic phone calls etc everything was set for the 20th. The Church had other events happening, so we couldn't use their car park. We decided it was easier to seek forgiveness than permission, so we would use the car park, across the road by the café.

I arrived really early, only to find the car park was full and the café buzzing. There were lots of people walking around in running gear. Turns out there was a Park Run on as well. This was about 9am and bikes were due to start turning up about 10:30, but as it turned out all the Park Run pers had mostly left by the time the bikes started arriving. Needless to say that, the Café was busy.



About 80 bikes showed up, some riders in very interesting costumes. The theme was yellow and there was a group with banana costumes. The group, led by John with Vicky in the middle and Nigel from Road Warriors, riding tail end Charlie, headed out and then Martin< Neville and I packed up and went to Cyclespot to set up. The guy running the BBQ already had sausages on the grill and the bikes started arriving about 1:20 and unexpectedly they all arrived following John into Cyclespot, with only a couple of stragglers. The ride a success, tales of the ride were recounted over a sausage and soft drink. Various speeches, thankyou's and the raffle prizes drawn, everyone I spoke to all had a good time. Here's to next year's event, as to what that will look like, we'll keep you informed.

RUBBER DUCKIE EVENT 2025

Peter Naylor and I go on the 2025 Rubber Duckie.

Saturday 20th September was the day for the 2025 Vintage Car Club (VCC) Taranaki Rubber Duckie. Probably, like many other Ulyssean, Peter Naylor and I share our time around over many bike clubs. Perhaps the VCC means cars to you? Throughout NZ, there is a very strong fraternity of motorcycling within the VCC. Many events are held that capture our interest and hence we were in Taranaki for the 2025 experience.

This year was the 48th time the Rubber Duckie has been held, so called as the Taranaki weather in September most means rain. This year was an exception and on the Rally Day, we could not have experienced better motorcycling weather. The day was fine with perfectly clear sky, albeit a little cool. Around 46 entrants headed off from the start and Rally HQ at the New Plymouth Top Ten at Fitzroy. Although Vintage implies old and a defined period (in the VCC), there was only one bike, a 1925 Harley and sidecar that fitted into this category. Most bikes, from a look around, would have fallen into the 1950 to 1990 range. (Acceptance of a qualifying vehicle in the VCC is 30 years and older). Pete went on his 1991 Harley Softail and sidecar, and I was on my 1981 Triumph Bonneville and sidecar. All up, there were 6 of the 46 vehicles with 3 wheels enjoying the Rally.

At Rally end, we had covered just under 100 miles. The morning section was the competitive component and the afternoon, a touring section. The route was excellent, 95% on rural sealed local roads and in the broad area encircled by Inglewood, Tarata, Onaero, with morning tea and lunch at the Huirangi Hall.



There were some notable encounters along the way. In the morning section, Pete was held up for a disconcerting length of time by bobby calves being herded down the road. This raised some anxiety for him as he was in the competitive section. His solution was to 'go for it' after freeing himself from these bovine youngsters. As the results were to later prove, this tactic was to his advantage as his points deduction was minimal compared to my own where my time and distance attention was clearly way off the competitive mark on this Rally. Another encounter for Pete was with an absolutely lovely (you have to be a bike person to appreciate this) Suzuki 500 Titan. This late 60's/early 70's 2 stroke was holding Pete up on his time recovery. This caused Pete to enjoy the 2T emissions head on as they exited the raucous twin megaphone exhaust.

We crossed the Bertrand Road Suspension Bridge 3 times. For those unfamiliar, this bridge crosses the Waitara River and is a listed historic structure and next year will be 100 years old. At over 60m in length, it is a replacement for the original bridge which was built late in the 19th century. These days only light traffic has access to cross. Further on we passed by an on-land oil/gas drilling rig. Of the many highlights of the day, the provided morning tea was front running. Provided by a local women's group, I can't think of one better on a biking event.



The Rally ended back at the Top 10 with enough time to get our rigs back on the trailers and tied down for the Sunday trek back to South Auckland. Saturday night found us at the Rally dinner and prizegiving. Pete and I did fine with the dinner but weren't good enough to be amongst the prizes. Not even in the raffle, but then a ticket is needed to be a participant, and we didn't have a ticket.

Top marks to the Taranaki VCC for the Rally and organising the superb weather and the Rally route.

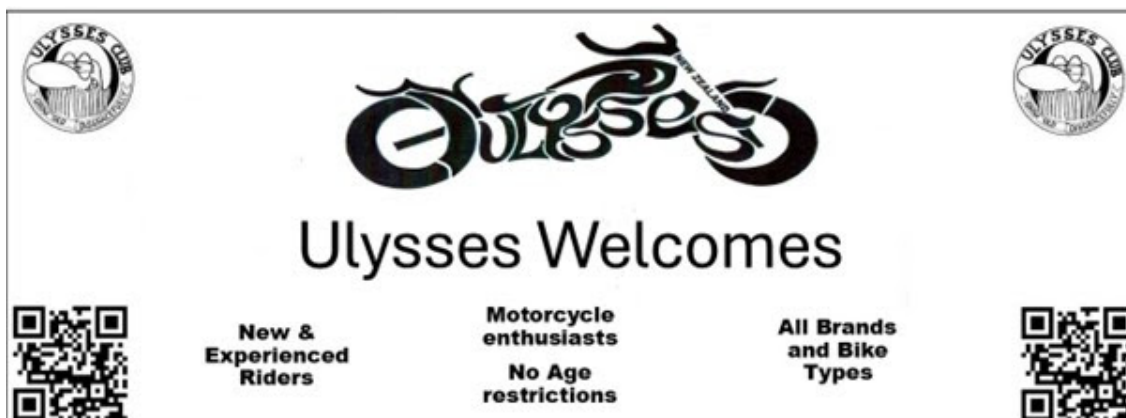
